

















Expected Outcomes

- In the next 5 years, we will cover all the districts in Bangladesh to promote awareness and provide CCT to improve sexual and reproductive health and rights
- Increased awareness about maternal health leads to healthier pregnancies.
- Reduction in teenage pregnancies due to enhanced awareness and access to contraception and reproductive health services Increased access to comprehensive sexual education and healthcare services for adolescents.
- Collaborate with other NGOs, women's rights groups, labour unions, and civil society to develop comprehensive policy recommendations that address the specific needs and rights of pregnant women.





Recommendations

Using a global website platform to share SRHR knowledge and ensure adolescents can study from these sources while remaining anonymous.

A secure, dependable, trustworthy, and readily available setting is required to discuss sensitive topics with adolescents.

To effectively target young audiences, we should consider the "reliability" of sources. Keeping their personal information private and using standard SRHR services to connect with appropriate options for service.

The school curriculum should include psychosocial knowledge and skills. It will provide SRHR education with a focus on developing practical skills.

Combating the stigma and shame associated with SRHR concerns, use digital platforms to disseminate SRHR knowledge.
