“**Transforming SRHR: Transgender Diversities in Bangladesh**”

**Dates: 12- 14 February 2017**

**ABOUT THE COURSE:**

The three day long course is designed for practitioners, researchers, students and activists from various disciplines. It will provide conceptual clarity and explore marginalised gender identities in relation to transgender and SRHR practices. The course will further delve into larger histories of transgender and shifting meanings of the term. Finally, this course will be an attempt to start critical dialogues around hijra, transgender identity, body, gender and SRHR, and mobilise advocacy to address policy issues.
