

# Expert Meeting on Delivering good quality CSE beyond conventional settings

Share-Net Netherlands kindly invite you to an online expert meeting on Delivering good quality CSE beyond conventional school and youth group settings.

This webinar is an initiative of our Community of Practice (CoP) on Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE), which is composed by representatives of Aidsfonds, Dance4Life, Edukans, KIT Royal Tropical Institute, RNW Media, Rutgers, The Hunger Project and the University of Amsterdam.

The current COVID-19-related restrictions on movement and access to services will serve as backdrop to the discussion of alternative modes of delivery for young people in both (peri) urban and rural settings. The aim of this expert meeting is to provide a platform for exchange of information on, and experiences with, different modes of CSE delivery beyond conventional classroom or youth group settings.

### Room for discussion

After the presentations, there will be time for an interactive Q&A session moderated by Esther Miedema. Following the Q&A, participants will be split into groups and invited into Zoom breakout rooms. The speakers will join a group and present a question or topic for further discussion. The meeting will close with a brief reflection on main 'take aways'.

## **Expected take aways**

After the event, Share-Net will produce a knowledge product to capture the main learning from this meeting. The expected result will include a mapping of inspiring CSE initiatives of Share-Net partners for in- and out-of-school youth in different (urban and rural) settings, and elaboration of challenges and good practices in providing CSE via less conventional means.
